

Any Gauge Pattern: MITTENS FOR GROWING GRANDKIDS

choose any needle size and any yarn, then calculate gauge

2 at a time with a flexible loop needle & 4 dp needles

Or adapt pattern to 1 mitten at a time with double pointed needles

KNIT CUFFS

Cast on [C] _____ st and join, taking care not to twist; leave tails for row markers

Tie alternate color yarn scrap to tail to keep track of mitten # 1 (will be for the right hand)

Knit 2, purl 2 in ribbing for desired inches from cast on edge

Knit around for 1 row

INCREASE FOR THUMBS (you are beginning to make the thumbs now)

<u>HOW TO Right increase</u> Insert the right needle from the front into the side of the stitch below the next stitch on the left needle and knit it (helps to rotate L needle slightly toward you)

<u>HOW TO Left increase</u> Insert the left needle from the back into the side of the stitch 2 rows below the stitch on the right needle, pull it up and knit into the back loop

 FIRST increase row

- Knit 2
- Place marker
- Right increase (see "HOW TO right increase")
- Knit 2
- Left increase (see "HOW TO left increase")
- Place marker (there are now 4 stitches between markers)
- Knit to end of row
- 2) KNIT AROUND
- 3) Increase EVERY OTHER ROW between markers until there are [H] _____ stitches
 - Knit 2
 - Slip marker
 - Right increase
 - Knit until next marker
 - Left increase
 - Slip marker
 - Knit to end of row
- 4) Continue to knit around on [H] _____ st for [F] ____ inches from ribbing, keeping markers in place

FINISH THUMBS: Use dp needles for thumbs, with other stitches on holders

Mitten # 1:

- Slip to marker, remove marker
- Slip 1
- Place slipped stitches on holder
- Cut yarn
- Knit [G] _____ stitches in the round for thumb, pulling snug

Mitten # 2:

- Slip to marker, remove marker
- Slip 1
- Place slipped stitches on holder; cut yarn
- Knit next [G] _____ stitches in the round for thumb, pulling snug (attach yarn for thumb and put remaining stitches on holder)

Knit [D] _____ inches from ribbing for each thumb

K2tog around

Cut yarn and weave through remaining sts, pull firmly and secure

KNIT PALMS: Return all stitches to flexible loop

★Take care to place the working needles of flexible loop to begin with the first st of mitten # 1, located 1 inch from thumb, as shown below: (Need help here? So do I...see page 4)

The FIRST stitch of mitten # 1 is [A] _____ st from thumb

The LAST stitch of mitten # 2 is [A] ____ st from thumb

In the standard state of mitten # 2 is [A] ____ st from thumb

Divide evenly between front and back of each mitten, removing remaining markers

You should have [J] ___ st for each mitten

First round: Attach yarn, secure cut ends, keep snug between needles

Pick up enough stitches at thumb gap to = $\frac{1}{4}$ " for children or $\frac{1}{2}$ " for adults ($\frac{1}{4}$ or $\frac{1}{2}$ of gauge)

Plus 1 stitch if necessary to make an even number of stitches for each mitten

Decrease (k2 tog) 2 stitches at the opposite side of each mitten

Continue decrease 2 stitches at opposite side until there are [J or J+1] ______ stitches

Continue to work in knit around until mittens measure [E] _____ inches from ribbing (For bulky or fine yarn you may need to \(\tau \) or \(\dagger \) the length here)

<u>DECREASE FOR FINGERTIPS</u>: Decrease each side of the front of each mitten and each side of the back of each mitten (4 st per round)

EVERY ROUND

- Knit 1
- Slip 1 (as if to knit)
- Knit 1
- Psso (pass slipped st over k stitch)
- Knit to last 3 sts
- K2 tog
- Knit 1

Continue decrease rounds until [K] _____ st remain; ↑ or ↓ to keep front and back equal Cut yarn from mittens, leaving 20" tails

BIND OFF: (bind off each mitten separately)

Put remaining front stitches on a safety pin and remaining back stitches on another safety pin

Turn mittens inside out and carefully return st from safety pins to 2 dp needles

Bind off 2 rows at the same time, using a third needle

Weave in ends, sew thumb gap if necessary

For the little ones, make [L] _____ inches of cord (see p 4); sew firmly to cuff

HOW TO RETURN MITTENS TO FLEXIBLE LOOP

Transfer all stitches to dp needles, 2 needles for each mitten


Arrange stitches so thumbs begin [A] _____ st (1 inch) from side of each mitten

Divide stitches evenly between front and back of each mitten ([J] ______ stitches)

If you have an uneven number of stitches you will increase at the thumb seam as you begin to knit around the palms

Place mittens with thumbs up as shown (each mitten is on 2 dp needles)

Place mitten # 1 (identified by its scrap yarn on the cast-on tail) on the left as shown



See diagram below as a guide to inserting the flexible loop


Insert one end of the flexible loop needle into the BACK of mitten #1

bend the loop

bring the same end of the flexible loop needle through the thumb side of mitten # 1
Insert the other end of the flexible loop needle into the BACK of mitten # 2

bend the loop

bring the same end of the flexible loop needle through the thumb side of mitten # 2



You are ready to begin knitting the first stitch of mitten # 1

HOW TO MAKE CORD

- Using 2 dp needles, CO 3 stitches
- Slide stitches to right side of left needle (do not turn the needle)
- Knit the 3 stitches
- Again slide stitches to right side of left needle (never turn the needle), and knit
